BOOKING INFORMATION

- o There may be other activities at the Museum that evening or other groups staying overnight. All groups have separate sleeping areas and evening activities.
- o If you need to cancel your overnight, we ask that you do so at least ten business days prior to your event date. By doing so, your full payment may be transferred to an alternate date. If you cancel within ten business days of your event; you are able to transfer your total payment minus the 50% non-refundable deposit to an alternate date only.
- o Our Deluxe Family Overnights are outdoor programs, on our Colonial Education Site with two reproduction Pilgrim Homes. There are alternate sleeping locations available, if you and your family prefer to not sleep outdoors in inclement weather.

- o 50% non-refundable deposit is required two weeks from your initial contract.
- o Full payment is due two weeks prior to your scheduled program date.

WHAT TIME DO WE ARRIVE AND WHERE DO WE GO?

Our address is 137 Warren Avenue, Plymouth, MA 02360. Bus parking is in the lower level. Car parking is the upper parking lot. Please leave your luggage in your vehicle until instructed by your Museum Overnight Host. After checking in at the Visitor Center, your group will receive wrist bands for each participant in your overnight program. This is your admission ticket and must be displayed on your wrist throughout the duration of your visit.

Our Deluxe Family Overnights have a unique schedule of activities, so your Museum Educator will be contacting you ahead of your program arrival date to go over your itinerary. Please supply our Reservations & Scheduling Coordinator, Sarah Dery, and a contact telephone number for the day-of your overnight, so we can ensure you are greeted upon arrival.

WHO IS CONDUCTING THE OVERNIGHT?

All of Plimoth Plantation's Museum Educators are experienced staff members. Your group will be assigned a program teacher and an overnight host. Your Overnight Host will be on site and available all night.

SHOULD I BRING FOOD?

Dinner and breakfast are provided (contact our Reservations & Scheduling Coordinator for menu details). You are welcome to bring an evening snack. Those with food allergies are encouraged to bring supplemental food.

Please note there is no refrigeration storage or microwave available. Plimoth Plantation premises are not 100% nut free. There are no alcoholic beverages allowed at overnights at Plimoth Plantation. If alcohol is found with your group, you will be asked to leave immediately.

WHERE WILL WE BE SLEEPING?

In an authentic 17th century bed! Your mattress may be stuffed with straw or feathers. Plimoth Plantation built two houses for the popular PBS program, Colonial House (2004), and moved them to the museum grounds after shooting finished. The houses are "earthfast," meaning the floors are dirt. Walls are made of clay, earth, straw and water, and there are no screens in the windows. There are a limited number of camping cots available for use. You will be able to use a modern bathroom, but there are no showers.

WHAT SHOULD WE BRING WITH US?

It's a wonderful adventure, so please plan accordingly. Plimoth Plantation strongly recommends bringing sleeping bags and/or sheets and blankets to ensure your comfort. A limited number of camping cots are available upon request. You may also want to bring bug spray, citronella candles, etc. You will have an overnight host available all night in the event of an emergency.

DO YOU HAVE A CANCELLATION/REFUND POLICY?

If you need to cancel your overnight, we ask that you do so at least ten business days prior to your event date. By doing so, your full payment may be transferred to an alternate date. If you cancel within ten business days of your event, you are able to transfer your total payment minus the 50% non-refundable deposit to an alternate date.
